Unsuitable and Immodest Dress (page 20) Please be sure to address these points
Our purpose for a dress code is to maintain a focus on learning in a non-disruptive, safe, and healthy environment

- Unsuitable
 - Gang related
 - Promoting use of tobacco, alcohol, or controlled substances
 - Sexually inappropriate
 - Vulgar or obscene words, phrases, or illustrations

- Language, lettering or symbols which create a hostile or intimidating environment
- Immodest – this is the change – Important to note that only a few students have been confronted on their immodest clothing so far this year. Now that the change has been pointed out to students, all teachers and staff members are going to address immodest dress with students when they see it.
 - Bare midriffs
 - Backless, strapless, halter, or single strap tops
 - Pants or tops worn in a manner that exposes underwear

Public Display of Affection (page 20) Please be sure to address these points
