Principal's greeting

Greetings and welcome back to school,

What does it take to get school off to a great start?? For CHS, the answer is simple. Put the process in the hands of very competent, dedicated staff members and the massive task gets done smoothly and effectively with – new teachers being hired and oriented; textbooks ordered and materials on shelves; fall sports well underway; students placed in classes; fees collected; yearbooks purchased; paperwork filed, and on and on, so that finally, our kids can come to class, start to explore, wonder and learn still more.

My huge gratitude to the staff members who do this huge job with a very positive attitude that led one visitor looking to register her student to remark, "I have never been around such a warm, caring group of people that seem to genuinely care about my child."

Key thoughts for you as school starts –

packed lunch. Cost is \$2.50. Classes begin for ALL students at 11:50.

Freshmen and new students will use the regular bus route; buses will run again about 2 ½ hours later for sophomores, juniors and seniors on September 4 only. Only new students should come to CHS on the morning run. There is a late start for returning students.

Attendance

CHS needs your help in reporting absences. If your child has been, or will be absent, please **call the CHS Attendance Office at 757-5888** as soon as possible. If you do not call, the computer will record your child's absence as unexcused. After 48 hours, absences cannot be excused. Notes are not accepted in place of the phone call.

Absences may be excused at the request of a student's parent/guardian because of illness, disability, illness in the immediate family requiring the student's presence, a family emergency, religious reasons, or anything the school deems appropriate (up to 5 pre-arranged absences per semester). Students who are eighteen-years-old may request their own absences be excused.

Please encourage your child to attend all classes; but, if a class is missed, please clear excused absences in a timely fashion.

Parking and pick-up tips

Students and parents should be reminded that some parking areas are off-limits to students, including the front lot, the industrial compound and the area near the home economics wing. Student cars parked improperly or in inappropriate areas will be cited; continued offenses may lead to towing.

Your cooperation in making the area around CHS safe is appreciated. During the early morning and afternoon rush (7:25 – 7:45 AM and 3:05 – 3:25 PM):

- **Please do not drop off (or pick up) students in the parking lot in front of the main entrance to CHS!** This results in cars backed up on 11th Street, traffic jams and unsafe conditions for students and staff trying to get into the building. **Parking in the front lot is limited to staff.**
- Two good options for dropping off (and picking up) passengers are: **11th Street** in front of the school (**not in the parking lot!**) and **Pierce Street.**

Credit denial

Attendance is important - it is impossible for a student to learn from a teacher when the student does not attend class. Regular attendance is a key element in academic success. Poor attendance may result in failing grades or dropping out.

Corvallis High School has a policy allowing teachers to deny credit when a student has missed too many classes. The details of each class's credit denial policy rest with individual teacher, who must:

- identify how attendance and class participation relate to course instructional goals,
- and inform parents and students of the details of the policy.

There are procedures to appeal credit denial. Only unexcused absences can be counted toward credit denial. See the article on attendance for information about what constitutes an unexcused absence.

Make sure your child knows the credit denial policy in each class - details of the policy rest with each teacher and will vary.

Parent connection

We hope that CHS parents will be able to join us for the first meeting of the Parent Connection on Monday, October 21, at 7:00 PM. in the staff dining room. At that time our new principal, Jay Conroy, will introduce himself and outline his plans and visions for CHS. At the same time we will present an update on the bond measure and information about the potential new school building. This will be a great opportunity to get to know Jay and to hear about what changes might be in store for CHS. This evening meeting will be followed by more informal monthly noontime meetings (held in Beyond CHS, room 209) on November 14, December 12, and January 16. At those meetings you'll hear a brief update about current activities at CHS and have a chance to ask Jay general questions about school issues. It's also a great opportunity to network with other CHS Parents. You're welcome to bring a brown-bag lunch. If you have any specific items that you'd like to see on the agenda you may contact Jay Conroy at CHS or e-mail Ginny Adams at adamspvkt@attbi.com. We look forward to seeing you in October.

College planning night

CHS is very excited to be able to host College Planning Night, Monday, September 23, promptly at 7:00 PM, at LaSells Stewart Center on the OSU campus. Oregon State has agreed to again co-sponsor the event. We have invited Philomath High School to join us. The tentative schedule includes the following topics:

- ⇒ **NCAA** rules and regulations

Beyond CHS news

Beyond CHS will be closed on Fridays. Please plan out your business in Beyond CHS accordingly.

Transcripts: It is strongly recommended that students order all the transcripts they will need for college applications at one time. Order transcripts in Beyond CHS **well in advance of when you need them!** A schedule of how long it takes to get transcript orders filled is posted. The first two official transcripts are free, after that \$2 is charged for each copy (due when the order is placed). There is no charge for unofficial transcripts. **The student is responsible for picking up and mailing transcripts.**

PSAT alert for juniors (and sophomores): The Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT) is scheduled for **Saturday, October 19**. Juniors and sophomores may sign up for the PSAT after September 10 in Beyond CHS. The cost is \$15. This test provides practice for the SAT, but also will be used as the basis for the 2003 National Merit Scholarship awards. It's important!

Plan out college admission tests: It is usually a mistake to wait until the beginning of the senior year to take standardized tests required for college admission (ACT, SAT and SAT II). A little time spent planning out the right time to schedule these tests is well spent. If you are aiming for a top level or private school, the SAT II may be required. Some students should take SAT II subject tests as early as the freshman or sophomore year. For advice on when or if you should take a test, inquire at Beyond CHS.

Beyond CHS volunteers

Are you looking for an opportunity to help students at CHS? Volunteering at Beyond CHS is a great way to help out as well as a chance to educate yourself about what the future holds for your child. Parents usually volunteer for a two-hour shift each week, and we pair new volunteers with someone who is more experienced.

Please call Emily Miller at 758-8140 if you would like to volunteer in Beyond CHS this year to set up your time. For new parents, Beyond CHS is the college and career center at Corvallis High School. No experience is necessary, but you must be willing to attend training sessions. We ask for a two-hour commitment every week or every other week. **All returning and new volunteers will be required to attend one of two training sessions to work in Beyond CHS this year.** Our first training session will be on Thursday, August 29, from 8:30 AM - 11:00 AM, our second training session will be on Monday, September 9, from 6:30 PM - 9:00 PM. Both training sessions will be in Beyond CHS, Room 209. **YOU ONLY NEED TO COME TO ONE, BUT YOU DO NEED TO COME TO ONE.**

Class standing

Freshmen, sophomores, and juniors must accumulate a minimum number of credits each year to achieve the next class standing the following school year. These credit designations help students and parents determine if a student is progressing satisfactorily toward graduation.

- a freshman must accumulate 10 credits to attain sophomore standing
- a student must have acquired 20 credits to move from sophomore to junior status
- senior standing is achieved by earning 34 credits by the end of the junior year

Students deficient in credits were notified at the end of last semester. Students register for fall semester with their designated class. Students who achieve 34 or more credits by the end of fall semester will be awarded senior standing at that time. All other changes in class status will take place at the end of the school year.

Catering for funds

Corvallis Food Service has been partnering with school groups around the district to help them in money-making efforts.

How does this work? Any school group can sign up with the Food Service Catering Department. The group will then need to choose some fundraising ideas like selling baked goods, sending goodies to your favorite Spartan team, throwing a private dinner party, birthday party, holiday celebration, and or graduation parties for example. The Catering Department will provide all of the food and service for the event and the school group receives a portion of the profit.

School zones

The 20 miles per hour speed limit in school zones around Corvallis applies **twenty-four hours per day, seven days per week, 365 days per year, whenever students are present on school grounds**, including sports events, music performances, etc. Students do not need to be visible, only present. Students are defined as "anyone under the age of eighteen." The cost of a violation is expensive! Most traffic fines are doubled in school zones in the Corvallis School District.

Please be extra cautious when carrying water bottles (or other drinks) in your backpacks. If you must carry water bottles, keep them in a separate compartment from your books, or wrap them in a towel or T-shirt, to keep them from leaking or condensing on your books. CHS had to replace a lot of textbooks this past year due to mildew damage. YOU are responsible for the cost to replace any damaged books.

Spectator costs

Parents, friends, and relatives are encouraged to attend CHS sport events each season. Some sports will involve a spectator charge. There is an entrance fee for football and some other events (volleyball, girls/boys basketball, and wrestling).

A family or an individual pass is good for any home game all year and may be purchased in the CHS Activities Office, Rice's Pharmacy, or at the games.

Cleared for sports

To be cleared for sports, each athlete must:

- ◆ Read and sign the code of conduct (with parents), including academic requirements, training rules, and citizenship expectations.
- ◆ Have a sports physical if a freshman or junior (also sophomores and seniors if no report is on file from the previous year).
- ◆ Pay an athletic user fee of \$100 per sport (not to exceed \$250 per athlete or \$500 per family for the school year). Checks should be payable to "Corvallis High School."
- ◆ Carry medical insurance.

Once school begins, each athlete's attendance will be monitored daily. Unexcused absences will not be tolerated. Grades will be checked every nine weeks to make sure that athletic eligibility is maintained. Involvement in high school sports can improve student grades and leadership skills.

Supervision at athletic events

Families should be aware that children under high school age are not admitted to high school athletic events at without adult supervision. Any elementary or middle school student without adult supervision will be given the opportunity to contact parents and make arrangements to be picked up. Students who leave an athletic event before its completion will not be allowed to reenter. Also, students are **not** allowed to bring rollerblades, scooters, skateboards, or pets to school events. Volunteers for sports

Successful activities take a lot of support and volunteer time. In the past, CHS has been fortunate to have terrific support for its sports programs. Help doing things like taking money, filming games, measuring distance at the long jump pit, and sometimes providing transportation, are all needed. Helping out can be fun, and is always appreciated.
