## Dear Parents,

Spring is here and with this time of year come some reminders to help you and us have a successful wrap-up of this year and good preparation for next. Please read the following (and the related notes in the rest of the newsletter).

**Registration**— Students the first week back from spring break will be receiving registration paperwork, including a course catalog, that helps them select courses for next year. Please review with them, their projected coursework. Changes next fall will be very limited, so careful selection of courses and alternatives is critical.

**School Climate**— Safety, respect and responsibility are key components of our school climate. We are working hard to teach students and staff their responsibility for a safe and respectful environment, including quiet study areas, limited interruptions of class time, and absolutely no harassment. Please give us a call if you hear from your son or daughter information that gives you concern about our school climate.

**Projected Enrollment**— Due to a decline in the number of 8<sup>th</sup> graders, our CHS overall population will probably drop about 60 students for the fall of 2006. This will mean that we will have a reduction in staff of about two full-time teachers. Those reductions have not been named, but our plan is to spread them across the subject areas.

**Open Periods**—(*history and possible changes*) The two high schools are still looking at the problem of Open Periods and unsupervised time. For many students (probably the vast majority), these open periods are actually used very wisely to do homework, contact teachers, make appointments, etc. For some, though, these periods are unstructured and provide time for students to be distracted from their school work, or to actually leave school. The costs of supervising 9th graders during this unsupervised time, along with the indirect costs associated with students being distracted (poor attendance at other classes, pulling friends from classes, creating an attitude of undirected focus, etc.) all point to a need to review the Open Periods and to look for alternatives. Staff from both schools will be looking at the problem over the next six to eight weeks and will be making recommendations for possible solutions.

**Alcohol Awareness**—Please note that CHS is playing its part in educating students about the problems involved in student use of alcohol. We have hosted a community forum to highlight the problems and possible steps for parents to take to help keep their children safe. A great summary of that forum was sent to parents on our listserv. Most importantly, we will continue to be watchful for alcohol use at school activities and will use the incentives of our Athletic/ Activities Code to encourage students to avoid alcohol and parties. However, we know we need strong support of parents. We also need to be clear that many parties/ activities that are going on in the community are not sponsored by or supervised by school personnel. Please monitor your child's participation in those activities—including pre-activity socializing. We want students to be engaged in positive, enjoyable activities that are safe.

**School safety**—At CHS we have no tolerance for violence. Students who engage in assaults (historically, we have very few) will be immediately suspended from school and the Corvallis Police will be called for pursuit of possible criminal charges. There is an expectation for students to work out their differences by using school counselors, resource personnel and peer mediators. Please let us know if your child is feeling unsafe or harassed. We can make a difference with your help.

**New Assistant Principal**— We are pleased to announce that Eric Wright will be our new Assistant Principal for the coming year. He replaces Joyce Wahl who has been at CHS for six years and who is retiring. We will sorely miss Joyce's huge kindness and service. We wish her all the best in her well-deserved retirement. More details on Eric will be coming in future newsletters along with news of other staff changes.

As always, thanks to all of you for your support of CHS and for working hard with us to provide your students with a great education.

To help nurture world peace, bring “a piece” of the world into your home by hosting an AFS (American Field Service) international high school student. Your family’s world will expand and the daily news reports will take on new meaning, because you know someone who calls another country “home.” Life time relationships are formed.

AFS Intercultural Programs, a volunteer-based, non-profit organization, has been sponsoring high school student exchanges for 59 years in a continuing effort to promote world peace through person to person relationships. The host family and the school are basic to the success of the program’s goals. The Corvallis AFS Chapter is searching for potential CHS host families for the 2006-07 school year. There is a small tax deduction and the chapter funds school-related and enrichment expenses. Local AFS volunteers support the international students and host families with orientations, guidance and activities. This year the Corvallis AFS Chapter celebrates its 46th birthday!



There are two slots reserved for AFS students and one for a FLEX (Future Leader Exchange) or YES (Youth Exchange and Studies) student. We may have a student from Corvallis’ Sister City Uzhgorod, Ukraine or other former USSR country through the FLEX program. YES is a new program which gives priority to students coming from predominately Muslim countries.

## Dances/Social Events

The rules of good conduct and grooming shall be observed for school dances and social events. All students and guests must have photo identification and show it at the door. Student body cards are preferred. Additional charges may be added for students without student body cards. No guests in middle school or age 19 or over are allowed. All guests must be registered in the main office by the host student by the established deadline. The person inviting the guest will share responsibility for the conduct of the guests. Anyone leaving before the official end of the activity will not be readmitted. Breathalyzers may be used for students suspected of alcohol use.

## Registration for 06-07

Registration for our 9th, 10th and 11th graders will take place over the first two weeks of April. Students will be getting their course catalogs on Tuesday, April 4 in large class meetings where counselors and administration will highlight changes and new opportunities for the 06-07 school year. On Wednesday, April 5, students will receive their registration paperwork. They will meet with their advisors and go over transcripts and 4 year plans before beginning the actual registration process. Students will need to confer with parents, get parent signatures and return the completed paperwork by Wednesday, April 12.

**Please note the following when helping your child select courses for next year:**

Carefully select your courses for next year. CHS hires our staff and divides class loads based on the courses students select when they register for classes. We will not be able to offer schedule changes based on you changing your mind or your preference. We will offer limited changes to those students who have been closed out of all of the classes they requested (if they listed alternatives). Failure to list alternatives will mean you will be placed in the best available alternative that we can find and you will not be able to change. Thank you for your cooperation and best efforts at doing a good job of registering for classes.

**ASSUMPTION OF LIABILITY AND RISK AGREEMENT**

I acknowledge that climbing is a dangerous activity with the potential for death, serious injury and property loss. I realize that the inherent risks of climbing include, but are not limited to falls, equipment failure, bad decision making, inattentive belayers and holds that have become loose or damaged by other climbers. I understand that there are freakish accidents and I assume all risks associated with such accidents even though I cannot foresee them.

I agree to pay attention to the condition of the ropes, harnesses, anchors and all equipment and to advise the facility staff if I do damage or notice any damage. I agree to abide by all gym rules and if the facility staff make a specific request or instruction of me, I agree to comply.

I am physically fit and know of no medical reason why I should not participate in this activity.

I give permission for the facility staff to seek medical services for me should I become injured or ill with the understanding that I am responsible for any expenses incurred. I fully understand that Oregon State University does not pay any medical insurance coverage for me while participating in this facility.

I agree to assume all risk of personal injury, including paralysis and death, medical expenses, disability, lost wages, loss of earning capacity and property damages and loss incurred while participating at the ORS Indoor Climbing Center. I hereby release Oregon State University, the Department of Recreational Sports the City of Corvallis and any of their agents and employees from any loss, liability, damage or costs including court costs and attorney fees that they may incur due to my participation in this activity, whether caused by negligence of the ICC staff or other parties released. I understand this agreement is binding on my family, heirs and executors.

I have read the above assumption of risk and fully understand its purpose. I willingly sign below and represent that I am 18 years of age or older, or that my parent/legal guardian has read and signed as well.
