Dear Parents,

This is my last note to you as CHS' Principal and I want to use this opportunity to say "Thank you" so much and to assure you that I am tremendously optimistic about the work that we have done and the exceptional quality of school and programs that are in place for years to come at CHS.

Thank you—to the staff at CHS. During times of unprecedented tight budgets, new government mandates and staffing changes CHS has seen teachers and support staff shoulder both the burdens of the largest class size average in the state and the challenge of continuing to offer a safe, positive, responsive environment for students. Test scores, graduation rates, merit scholars, AP programs, athletics and activities, transfers to CHS, and much more—all have shown the high quality of work and the exceptional opportunity provided by our staff. They have been patient with me, worked with me, not against me, and I have learned the truth of effective leadership—support down (they are where the work really gets done) and challenge up (they have the best insight and understanding for how to educate our children).

Thank you—to the students. I joined the teaching 'vocation' because I am truly in awe when I watch students grow into young men and women—the opportunity to help them 'turn on lights' of understanding and gain confidence in their own abilities and goals is simply humbling and hugely rewarding. Our CHS students are great 'kids' who respond to genuine care and appropriate challenges. They have taught me and I am very thankful.

Update—I can state with the greatest confidence that CHS is in great shape to continue, and even improve, its reputation as a school with exceptionally strong academics, a variety of programs aimed at the whole spectrum of students' needs and interests, all in an atmosphere of caring, respect and safety for all students and staff. We have hired tremendous new staff to fill spots created by the local option levy and by retirements. They come with great reputations in other districts or in their academic programs, and they have that wonderful attitude (from early impressions) that has been a hallmark of CHS staff—high standards, caring, hardworking, knowledgeable and intent on helping students of all types achieve success. I have also had the opportunity to work with CHS' in-coming principal, Suzanne Dalton, and believe that she will work very well with our exceptional team of Rynda Gregory and Eric Wright, assistant principals, and Sherry Faller, Lynn Dickson, Linda Keller, Zoe Silbernagel, Bob Holt and Jan Walker, (and all our staff). In short, the entire staff is exceptional—CHS will be a great place for students to come to learn and grow and prepare for next steps.

As for me—I am full of pride, sadness, optimism and hope. Sad to leave a great school and the huge piece of my life it has been. Proud of the work we all have done for "our kids". Most importantly, I'm very optimistic and hopeful about both the years ahead for CHS and the work, challenges and opportunities ahead for me. Thank you for all you have done and for your support.

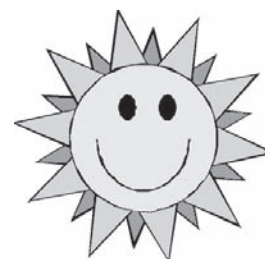

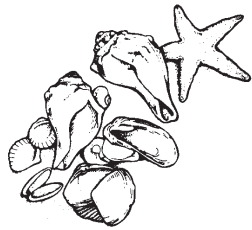

Food That's IN When School Is OUT

The Corvallis School District Food Service is working to make sure that no children in Corvallis go hungry when school is closed this summer. Over 2300 children in Benton County receive free or reduced-price meals during the school year, but many of these children do not get enough to eat when school is out. The Summer Food Service Program ensures that low-income children continue to grow and learn during the summer.

Sharon Gibson, Director of Food & Nutrition Services for the Corvallis School District recognizes the need for the program in Corvallis. "Many of our children who rely on school breakfast and lunch during the school year, do not have the energy they need during the summer. That's where we come in, by providing nutritious meals and activities to keep kids nourished and engaged. Our responsibility to kids doesn't end when school lets out. Kids who get enough to eat and have safe activities to participate in during the summer are less likely to get into trouble. Our summer meals program is a building block in the community for healthy, happy kids who are ready to learn."

Children can have free breakfast and lunch while school is out during the summer. All children 18 years and younger are welcome to eat at one of the following locations. All food must be eaten on site.

Getting Cleared for High School Sports

It is not too soon to begin preparing for next year's fall sports season.

Conditioning week begins on Monday, August 13th (optional) and official practice will begin on Monday, August 20th. To start practice on August 20th, you must first be cleared for sports in the Athletic Office during the period between Wednesday, August 15th and Friday, August 17th from 2:00-5:30pm. Each athlete must:

- Read and sign the code of conduct (with parents); includes academic requirements, training rules and citizenship expectations.
- Have a sports physical if a freshman or junior (also, sophomores and seniors if no physical is on file from the previous year).
- Everyone must complete a health history/emergency information form yearly
- Complete travel permission form
- Pay an athletic user fee. \$125/1st sport; \$100/2nd sport; \$75/3rd sport each year (not to exceed \$500 max per family per year). NO REFUND ON USER FEES AFTER THE 5TH WEEK OF THE SEASON (BASED ON OSAA START DATE).
- Carry medical insurance and purchase a student body card at school registration

Attendance

Attendance Office at 757-5888

Absences may be excused at the request of a student's parent/guardian because of illness, disability, illness in the immediate family requiring the student's presence, a family emergency, religious reasons or anything the school deems appropriate (up to 5 pre-arranged absences per semester). Students who are eighteen years old may request their own absences be excused.

Do you still get a phone call from the "Automated" call system? - even AFTER you have called the Attendance line to excuse your student? Please be aware that when you have called to excuse your student from being absent for a certain period class, your student still may have missed another class the same day, in which the Automated phone system will dial out for the class that is left unexcused.

An "Attendance Record" is posted outside of the Attendance Office. This record shows the student's attendance for the previous day and current day. If you receive an "Automated" telephone call stating that your student has missed one or more classes, please have your student check the attendance record to see which teacher marked them absent. If this was an error the student and teacher can resolve it.

Guidelines for Student Visitors

- Visitation is not allowed if the guest student lives within 60 miles of Corvallis (Valley League principal's agreement).
- The guest must be of high school age and a "student in good standing" at their school.
- A "Visitor's Request Form" must be completed by the host student at least 24 hours prior to the visit (available in the main office).
- Any violation of school guidelines during the visit may result in both students being sent home.
