May is here and CHS is bursting with activity and good learning. Advanced Placement tests will begin next week, providing Spartans with an excellent opportunity to earn college credit and demonstrate their knowledge in a wide variety of subjects. Much credit goes to the exceptionally strong staff of teachers who invest a great deal of time and effort to provide our students with this excellent foundation for college.

Darfur Assembly—On Tuesday, May 1, 2007, our student body will host Mr. Daniel Garang for an eye-opening and informative presentation on the history and present situation in Darfur. Students from Mr. Rich Larrowe’s Global Studies class came up with the project, researched the speaker and made the arrangements for the presentation.

Mr. Spartan—Nine young men and twelve young women wrapped up an unbelievably successful effort on behalf of Good Samaritan Hospital and the Mario Pastega House with the Mr. Spartan “pageant.” These outstanding students and citizens chosen by students and staff to participate, raised over \$47,400 which will be divided evenly between Good Sam and the Pastega House. Thanks also to their energetic and hardworking advisor, Jane Kiekel, for her excellent guidance and support.

Oregon Athletic Director of Year—Bob Holt, CHS’ “super-man” responsible for providing an outstanding, well-rounded program of athletics to well over 50% of our student body was recognized by the Oregon Athletic Directors Association with the “Athletic Director of the Year” (for 5A schools) award in late April. Elaine Markley, former middle school teacher and long-time Spartan volunteer, received an award from the same group for Distinguished Service, recognizing her huge efforts on behalf of our Spartan athletes helping them succeed in the classroom, as well as on the “field.” Thanks from all of us at CHS for the work these two “true Spartans” do.

Prom- Prom is right around the corner and the junior class is hosting juniors, seniors and their “dates” (often it’s more “group dates”) for a wonderful evening of dancing and good times. Held at Ashbrook School, the prom is a highlight for students, but we want parents support in making the evening safe for all. Please join us in guiding their behavior with encouragement and expectations clearly stated.

All-night party—Speaking of celebrations, the Senior All-night Party is a longstanding answer to the need for a safe and positive celebration for graduates at CHS. Senior parents are doing the work and details for great games, food, movies and entertainment are being finalized. Thanks to all who step up and make this work.

Thank you and best wishes—Therese Patterson, math teacher extraordinaire, is retiring this year and Jenni Peterson, a math dept. colleague, is taking a leave of absence for the coming year. Our deepest thanks, appreciation and best wishes go to both.

New teachers—Interviews are moving ahead for new teachers slots paid for from new levy dollars next year. An unexpected opening comes with the news that Erin Walcon, will be leaving CHS for work in London with children’s theater. Erin has simply been outstanding in reinvigorating our drama program and mentoring scores of students in both acting and the tech side of theater. She will be sorely missed, but we wish her well in her next steps. Several promising applicants for her position are being reviewed and a new hire will hopefully be announced by the end of the month.

How to prepare your collage(s) - 2 maximum:

1. Gather a collection of photos of your senior at different ages; include snapshots that show your senior with other classmates. You could also include clips from posters/programs from sporting, music dance and drama events.
2. Arrange the materials horizontally on a sheet of **11" x 17" paper**. No larger please. You don't need to cut up your photos, just "stick" them to your base paper with a dab of glue or two sided tape. The items can overlap with each other, and can extend a bit beyond the edge of the paper (the extension will not be photocopied).
3. Take your collage(s) to a print shop, and request that a color copy be made. Be sure to make extra copies to keep for yourself or to send to family and friends. The following stores do color copying: Henderson's, Staples, Office Max, and Kinko's. Please laminate your collage(s) before turning them in.
4. Place your student's name on the **FRONT** of the collage(s). On the **BACK**, print your student's name, address, phone number, school, and graduation year. This is important for identification purposes. (Return your photos to your albums or shoebox collection!)
5. Deliver your collage(s) to your student's high school office by **May 21**. We will arrange the display for the party. After the party, the collages will **not** be returned and will be stored for display at the ten year reunion!

A message from Benton County Health Department Turn off the TV and turn on life!

Spring and summer is the perfect time to get into habits of healthy living such as less TV and more physical activity! There are a number of negative impacts of kids watching too much TV: less family time, decreased reading and academic skills, higher likelihood of being aggressive as an adult, increase in sedentary lifestyle and negative nutrition habits. Here are some not so fun facts:

American children watch an average of three hours of television a day.

Children spend more time in front of the TV than they do in school each year.

40% of families always or often watch TV while eating dinner.

By age 18 American children will have seen an average of more than 200,000 acts of violence on TV.

The proportion of overweight children in the US has doubled since 1980.

"The easiest way to reduce inactivity is to turn off the TV set. Almost anything uses more energy than watching TV."

encourages families to make watching less TV a family endeavor. Some tips to reduce the hours spend watching TV include the following:

Keep the TV off during meals.

Do not use TV as a reward.

Remove the TV from your child's bedroom.

Artist Reception Celebrates New Public Art

The public is invited to celebrate new sculpture panels in the walkway overlooking the media center of Corvallis High School and meet the artist Steve Gardner, **Monday, June 4, from 6-7 pm.**

Seattle area sculptor and former CHS alumna Steve Gardner created the artwork with input from ceramics class students and other students who gave feedback after his initial designs were drawn. Gardner's bas relief (carved) ceramic tile panels are archtypal representations of "The Dreamer", "The Searcher", "The Explorer", and "The Warrior". To honor the diversity of the CHS student body he also includes references to cultural symbols such as the patterns in Chiapas textiles and Japanese Kanji (lettering).

Gardner began his public art career with an early installation here in Corvallis. His popular "The Berry Picker" graces the outside east facing wall of Leading Floral and was one of the first commissioned Madison Avenue Alley Art Surprises. He has become a very sought after artist creating public artwork in the Seattle metro area.

Funds for commissioning this work from Gardner were raised by the ARTs Committee, a team of dedicated individuals who felt strongly that exposure to the arts is critical to a well-rounded education. Studies have shown that students exposed to arts perform better in school. In early 2003, after passage of a bond measure to build two new schools, a group of citizens, artists, and district employees began meeting with the building architects to discuss incorporating art into the new buildings. As part of these discussions, the group learned there was no 1% for art on school bond measures. The ARTs Committee continued to meet with the architects to ensure that infrastructure for future artwork was in place and they began fund raising. This reception is a culmination of their efforts to install three major pieces, two for Linus Pauling Middle School and this sculpture for CHS. Donors to the project are invited to an invitation only time prior to the reception open for the public.

The total cost of each exam will be \$93 and the balance will be due by May 1. There are two physics tests at the AP level at \$93 each however, we will reduce the second exam in physics to \$70. Absences may be excused at the request of a student's parent/guardian because of illness, disability, illness in the immediate family requiring the student's presence, a family emergency, religious reasons or anything the school deems appropriate (up to 5 pre-arranged absences per semester). Students who are eighteen years old may request their own absences be excused.

Do you still get a phone call from the "Automated" call system? - even AFTER you have called the Attendance line to excuse your student? Please be aware that when you have called to excuse your student from being absent for a certain period class, your student still may have missed another class the same day, in which the Automated phone system will dial out for the class that is left unexcused.

An "Attendance Record" is posted outside of the Attendance Office. This record shows the student's attendance for the previous day and current day. If you receive an "Automated" telephone call stating that your student has missed one or more classes, please have your student check the attendance record to see which teacher marked them absent. If this was an error the student and teacher can resolve it.

Guidelines for Student Visitors

- Visitation is not allowed if the guest student lives within 60 miles of Corvallis (Valley League principal's agreement).
- The guest must be of high school age and a "student in good standing" at their school.
- A "Visitor's Request Form" must be completed by the host student at least 24 hours prior to the visit (available in the main office).
- Any violation of school guidelines during the visit may result in both students being sent home.
