Welcome back from Spring Break! It is hard to believe it is already April. I hope everyone had time to renew during vacation and you are ready for a strong finish to the 2008-09 school year. The school year has flown by and I have thoroughly enjoyed this first year at CHS. At CHS I have found a staff that is dedicated to the education and well being of students. I have also found a student body that is engaged, aware and very interested in their education.

There are still many more activities, events and important dates before the end of the year. Here are some of the highlights for the month of April:

- **Club Faire/8th Grade Open House-** April 1st in conjunction with 8th grade parent night, CHS clubs will have the opportunity to showcase what they have to offer students. As the administrator in charge of clubs, I am very impressed with the amount of clubs and the diversity of interest they cover. I would encourage students to join a club that would be of interest and if a club of interest doesn't exist to start one.
- **Parent-Teacher Conferences:** April 9th and 10th will be parent teacher conferences at CHS. Parents will be able to schedule times to speak with teachers as well as have the option of speaking with teachers in a drop in situation. The staff would like to encourage you to take this opportunity to speak with the teachers, visit the school and support your student's efforts in school.
- **Attendance:** It is well known that the goal for this year's attendance is 94%. We are slightly below that at present time with a 93%. To encourage students to have good attendance and boost our percentage, we have put together a class competition that will go month to month starting March 16th. The class with the highest percentage of attendance at the end of the month will receive a treat and names will be put into a drawing for gift certificates from local businesses. We are hoping to reach our 94% goal by the end of the year. Good luck students!!
- **Dual Language/ELL:** During the month of March, I was able to meet with a parent group representing the dual language class coming from Linus Pauling. Next year at CHS we will offer a Spanish literature and language class for the dual language students. Through this class we will teach advanced level Spanish skills as well as improve their academic language level. I was also able to meet with the parents of the English language Learners that will be attending CHS next year. I shared the new model of English Language Development services we have planned for next year. The students who qualify for the English Language Learner program will receive separate classes that focus on English language development and language arts skills. I am looking forward to working with these new programs next year.

This is a beautiful time of the year with many activities and work left to be done before the school-year ends. May the last few months of school be full of hard work, dedication and enjoyment.

Spring break has come and gone and we are in the home stretch of the 2008-2009 academic school year. Is your child on track for a successful second semester? There is still time to stage a comeback! A parent's job for a child in high school includes plenty of coaching, discipline and encouragement. Schoolwork can be meaningless if it is not connected to real-world outcomes. Consider the following...

- ✓ Overcome discouragement by breaking the remainder of the year into short-term goals that build on a yearend goal
- ✓ Help your student see the usefulness of school work by connecting lessons to hobbies or craft interests or even an opportunity to recognize the benefits of working through adversity
- ✓ Help develop good work habits of breaking study time into 30 minutes sessions with a 10 minute break in-between
- ✓ Use a planner or a "to do" list and make sure to cross completed tasks off in order to gain a sense of accomplishment

You can also speak with individual teachers in the subjects that your child is struggling in for additional suggestions and ideas. Corvallis High School has access to tutors that come to our school during the day to help students during their off block. 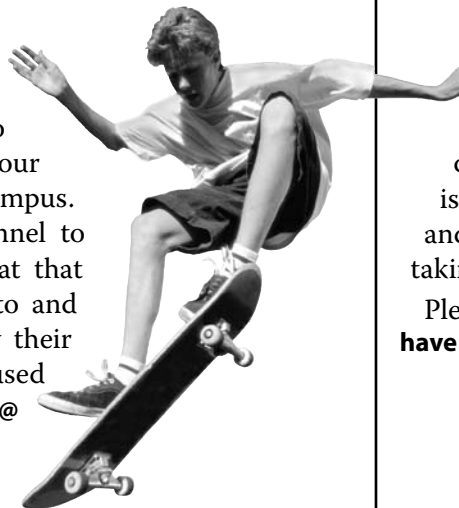

AP Exams

The final balance for the AP exams will be due no later than April 30. The balance for all exams except for the one physics test will be \$80. Physics E & M will have a balance of \$80 for the one and a reduced balance of \$69 for the other. The tests have been ordered but we may have a few extras in certain subjects if your student forgot to sign up or we can order late but there will be an extra charge. The Room # will be posted outside of Beyond CHS. All morning exams will begin at 7:30 a.m. (not 7:40). All afternoon exams will begin at 12:00 (students will need to eat lunch prior to this time). No mechanical pencils will be allowed, only #2 pencils and a pen with blue or black ink. Students will also need a calculator for certain tests.

If a student will be involved in an athletic competition, they may take their AP exam late however, there is a \$40 late fee and Nancy Schaffer will need to know as soon as possible in order to get the new exam here on time.

SAT

There is still some room for the SAT in June. You must register on line at www.collegeboard.com. We also will be able to give the SAT subject tests at this date. Subject tests are for students who think they may go to a selective school. They are usually taken when a student finishes precalculus or college/alg trig., AP U.S. History, Chemistry, Biology, 4th-5th year languages, etc. For more information, please have your student come to Beyond CHS. ACT

The late registration date for the April 4 ACT has passed. However, I believe there are still some spots left and a student could go what is called standby but there is an extra fee. Have your student check in Beyond CHS for further information.

College Acceptances

April can be a very stressful month as students and parents try to decide which college to send their student to and how much financial aid will they receive. We try to emphasize to the students that this is a family decision and to not put pressure on others about where they should or should not attend. College Now Credits

There are still questions about college now credit through LBCC. College Now is a program that students can earn college credit for certain classes they take at CHS. The total cost is \$25. 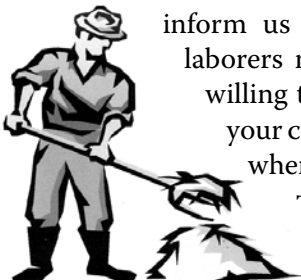
Ladies and Gentlemen,

Attendance

If your child has been or will be absent, please call the CHS Attendance Office at 757-5888 **within 48 hours**. If you do not call, the computer will record your child's absence as unexcused. After 48 hours, absences cannot be excused. Notes are not accepted in place of a phone call.

Absences may be excused at the request of a student's parent/guardian because of illness, disability, illness in the immediate family requiring the student's presence, a family emergency, religious reasons or anything the school deems appropriate (up to 5 pre-arranged absences per semester). Students who are eighteen years old may request their own absences be excused.

If a class is missed, clear excused absences in a timely fashion by calling to give the **exact date of absence**, time of day and please **spell the student's name clearly**.

Please be aware that when you have called to excuse your student from being absent for a certain period class, your student still may have missed another class the same day, in which the Automated phone system will dial out for the class that is left unexcused.

Please make arrangements with your student(s) prior to school hours about doctor and orthodontic appointments, as well as any other medical or non-medical appointments. All notes will be posted on student lockers as we try to avoid "reminder" notes to students. It disrupts class time.

Please check with your student to make sure they are able to check out library books and bookroom books. To do so, they need to have:

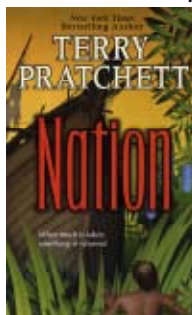
- Returned all overdue books, or paid for them

New: Nation

By Terry Pratchett, 2009 Michael L. Printz Honor Book

British author Terry Pratchett sold his first story when he was thirteen, and is now one of the most significant contemporary English-language satirists. He has won numerous literary awards and named an Officer of the British Empire "for services to literature." *Nation* is Terry Pratchett's first novel for young people that takes place outside of Discworld, about which he has written 36 books. In this award-winning book, a tsunami destroys everything on a small tropical island. Mau, a young man who escaped only because he was at sea during the storm, is the only survivor. Soon Daphne, an English girl, joins him. As others arrive, they set up their own nation. This title features serious questions, fascinating characters, action, humor, romance, and all sorts of discoveries that welcome every reader. An interesting note: Terry Pratchett has recently been diagnosed with early onset Alzheimer's disease. Let's hope we can still see more new books from him! This book is highly recommended.



What are some of Terry Pratchett's favorite authors?

Pratchett's earliest inspirations were *The Wind in the Willows* by Kenneth Grahame, and the works of Isaac Asimov and Arthur C. Clarke. His literary influences have been P.G. Wodehouse, Tom Sharpe, Jerome K. Jerome, Larry Niven, Roy Lewis, G. K. Chesterton, and Mark Twain. A Pearl of Wisdom from Terry Pratchett, May 21, 2001 "One of life's certainties is that there is generally a last chocolate hidden in all those empty wrappers."

Treasure Our Books

We do charge for damages, especially to our new books. Please remind students to cover their new semester textbooks with a sturdy paper cover, not write in them, and treat them gently.
