***Have a great summer. Take time to rest, to enjoy our beautiful world, and to be refreshed for a new and exciting fall.***

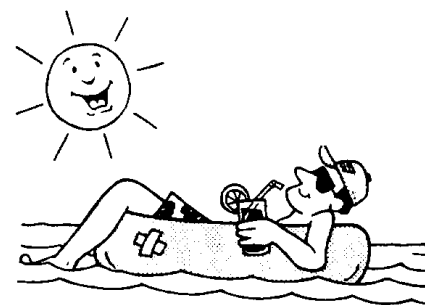

## SAT Review Course

The Assistance League will be offering SAT Review courses for high school juniors and seniors who are enrolled in Benton County schools. We will be offering a course in the fall and again in the winter. The purpose of the course is to help students become familiar with the SAT and to develop strategies for success. The course consists of seven class periods either on a Tuesday evening or a Saturday morning. Five class sessions will focus on math and verbal instruction; the sixth session will include a practice test; the seventh (last) session will be devoted to returning the practice test and giving students feedback.

## What a Year!

As usual, the time has come and gone more quickly than one might have imagined and we are once again ready to say our goodbyes for the summer. Before we exit however, the counseling department wanted to say thank you to all the students and their families for their hard work throughout the year. As well, we wanted to leave you with a few things to be aware of as you plan for next fall.

- Grades will be mailed out during the third week in June.
- If you are planning on playing a fall sport, contact the Athletic office 757-5917 for details regarding each sports summer workout program and preseason camps. In order to be eligible to participate, students must register and be cleared by the Athletic office prior to the first day of tryouts, which is August 24th. Remember, high school athletics require a 5-6 day commitment every week for approximately three months.
- The counseling office will reopen sometime during the middle of August (exact date and time will be available by calling 757-5881 after July 1st).
- All students are expected to register for the 2009/10 academic year and pick up class schedules during the week of the 24-27 of August. If for some reason there is a problem with a schedule, counselors will be available to problem solve some issues prior to the start of school. Once school begins, schedule changes are limited. Students typically do not get to add a class if they drop another class, nor do they get to add a class after the 5th day of the semester. The last day to drop a class without penalty is September 30th.
- Seniors, if you have not already started, now is the time to begin looking into the college application process. Next fall, many of you will need to gather recommendations and other materials from school staff. Be prepared to begin this collection process before October 1st. Make an appointment to see your counselor or stop by Beyond CHS in September if you have any questions.

## Attendance

If your child has been or will be absent, please call the CHS Attendance Office at 757-5888 **within 48 hours**. If you do not call, the computer will record your child's absence as unexcused. After 48 hours, absences cannot be excused. Notes are not accepted in place of a phone call.

Absences may be excused at the request of a student's parent/guardian because of illness, disability, illness in the immediate family requiring the student's presence, a family emergency, religious reasons or anything the school deems appropriate (up to 5 pre-arranged absences per semester). Students who are eighteen years old may request their own absences be excused.

If a class is missed, clear excused absences in a timely fashion by calling to give the **exact date of absence**, time of day and please **spell the student's name clearly**.

Please be aware that when you have called to excuse your student from being absent for a certain period class, your student still may have missed another class the same day, in which the automated phone system will dial out for the class that is left unexcused.

Please make arrangements with your student(s) prior to school hours about doctor and orthodontic appointments, as well as any other medical or non-medical appointments. All notes will be posted on student lockers as we try to avoid "reminder" notes to students. It disrupts class time.

## Getting Cleared for High School Sports

It is not too soon to begin preparing for next year's fall sports season. Conditioning week begins on Monday, August 17th (optional) and official practice will begin on Monday, August 24th. To start practice on August 24th, you must first be cleared for sports in the Athletic Office during the period between Wednesday, August 19th through Friday, August 21st from 2:00-5:30pm each day. Each athlete must:

- Read and sign the code of conduct (with parents); includes academic requirements, training rules and citizenship expectations.
- Have a sports physical if a freshman or junior (also, sophomores and seniors if no physical is on file from the previous year). If you had a physical your 8th grade year for track, please bring a copy of it with you.
- Everyone must complete a health history/emergency information form yearly (on front of physical form).
- Complete travel permission form
- Pay an athletic user fee of \$150/per sport (3rd sport each year is \$100 – exception is Ski and Lacrosse). **NO REFUND ON USER FEES AFTER THE 5TH WEEK OF THE SEASON (BASED ON OSAA START DATE).**
- Carry medical insurance and purchase a student body card at school registration

Every year we need help with not only checking all books in, but also repairing and returning them to the shelves. Please watch for an e-mail announcement or contact library staff at 757-5900 if you can help.

### Returning or Paying for All Library and Text Books and Fines

- Seniors must clear their library/bookroom accounts before graduation. Student records are not released until accounts are clear.
- **Freshmen, Sophomores and Juniors** must return all books on or before the last day of school.
- **There will be a \$10 late fee added to student accounts if they do not return their books by the end of school, and students will not be able to check out books next fall until they return all books and pay all fines.**
- **Please remind your students to** return their books in as good a condition as they received them: remove extra papers or sticky notes and erase any marks. We do charge for damage.
- **Students may check out textbooks over the summer** only if they have teacher permission and pay a deposit equal to the price of the book. This deposit will be returned when the book is returned in good condition.

“I think most kids’ books are stories. I like reading stories, but can’t write them. I write what I see. For my first two kids’ books, I spent a fall hanging out at country fairs and ballparks. I like nosing around and looking for the weird, something that hits me, a goofy gesture,” this author writes.

Elisha Cooper’s is best known for the wonderful children’s books that are the result of his “nosing around” various subjects of interest to youngsters. In this wonderful book for young adults Cooper documents the lives of eight students during their senior year at an alternative high school in Chicago. The result is very perceptive and often funny. Most students will identify with at least one of the eight young people, which represent a cross section of race, gender, participation in athletics, and academic achievement. Parents and teachers will also want to read this book to see high school from a student’s perspective. What fun!
