As a staff, we will be working on making sure that every student has connections with adults at school so that they will be more eager to make regular attendance a priority. Every student at CHS is assigned an advisor. This year, those advisor groups will meet weekly for a check-in, to work on educational planning activities, and to make sure that all students are getting the necessary information for their educational success. But more than that, this will be an adult who walks through 4 years of high school with the same small group of kids and can serve as an advocate and support for them. We don't want any student to be invisible at CHS and we hope that this will help us in that goal.

Some things to be sure to remember:

1. **September 17 is our Open House.** Please come and get acquainted with your students' teachers and get a better understanding of what is going on at CHS.
2. **September 22 is College Planning Night.** This is an incredible opportunity for students and their parents to get started in planning for life after high school – or at least take a look at some of the possibilities.

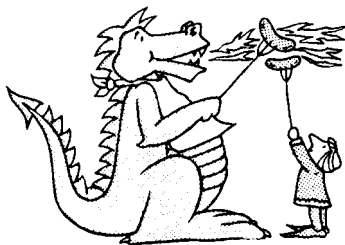

Do something different this year. Try Destination ImagiNation®!

Destination ImagiNation (DI), sponsored by Corvallis 509J Destination Imagination Organization, is a creative problem-solving program for students in grades kindergarten through 12. Imagine a program where kids have **FUN** learning creative problem-solving skills, construction techniques, set and costume design, script writing, and improvisation. This is DI! Students work in teams to create and perform a solution to one of five challenges. Each challenge blends a different mix of skills - some are more technical, some more mechanical or mathematical and others are more theatrical in nature. Teams also perform an instant challenge, given to them with just minutes to prepare. . There is a Rising Stars (non competitive) challenge for k-2 and Project Outreach, a service project challenge, as an additional opportunity for High School students only. *Crazy? Yes! Fun? You bet!*

How do teams form? Parents of interested students usually start the ball rolling. Teams of 5 to 7 students are grouped by age or grade (k-2, 3-5, 6-8 and 9-12). While teams are usually students from the same school, they can also be friends or neighbors. Teams need an adult team manager who facilitates the meetings (training and materials are included with registration). The registration costs are \$70 per student (\$50 for the second student in a family) and only \$30 for Rising Stars Participants. Teams form in October and work some in the fall, but January and February are busiest as teams prepare for the March regional tournament. Higher scoring teams progress to the state tournament at Oregon State University in April.

Health Room at CHS

Welcome to the '08/'09 school year. Please remember that if your student uses an inhaler or keeps an epi-pen or ana-kit with them at school (which is preferable), a medication form must be filled out and on file in the health room. Also, if you have signed the self-medication form and returned it to the school, it means that your student may bring a small amount of over-the-counter medicine to school to take as directed. They may not share it with other students nor will any medication be provided for them. Students may have prescription medicine with them only after filling out the proper forms and following the dictates of the district. Usual guidelines include bringing only one dose in a clearly marked prescription container and being sure the school is aware that the student has the medication. Also, please be sure that a number where you can be reached during the day is on file as we will try and get in touch with someone to get permission before sending a student home ill. Awards for Student Volunteers

Prudential Spirit of Community Awards

The Prudential Spirit of Community Awards, sponsored by Prudential Financial and administered by the National Association of Secondary School Principals, recognize middle and high school students for volunteer community service. Eligible applicants include any young person in the United States who is in grades 5-12 and has engaged in a volunteer activity that occurred at least partly during the 12 months prior to the date of application. Local honorees are selected in November, and from these winners two state honorees are chosen in each state and the District of Columbia. Out of the state honorees, ten national honorees are selected and announced at a ceremony in Washington, DC, in May of 2009. State Honorees receive an award of \$1,000 and an all-expense-paid trip to Washington, DC, for national recognition events. National Honorees receive an additional award of \$5,000. A family or an individual pass is good for any home game at CHS/CV all year and may be purchased in the CHS Athletic Office or at the ticket booth the first few games of each season.

Juniors - PSATs

Juniors may start to sign up for the PSAT on Monday, September 15. The cost of the exam is \$18 payable to CHS. The exam this year will only be given on Wednesday, October 15 during the school day. All sophomores will be required to take the exam at no cost to them as a result of state testing requirements. More information will be coming.

CHS Food Service

Welcome Back! Food Service has taken on a new look and has added new information on their website, such as healthy eating and healthy lifestyles. You may view school level menus on our website, too. In addition, at the school levels, we are adding a number of new, healthy snacks for school events or classroom parties. The Catering Menu and Price list is also on the website so you can work with Adrienne on your next catering event.

Free or Reduced-price meals are available to students whose households qualify based on income or receipt of food stamps/TANF benefits. Households must complete an application each year to receive Free or Reduced-price meal benefits unless you receive a letter stating that your child has been approved for free meals based on eligibility information that has been electronically transferred from the Oregon Department of Human Services. If you do not receive a letter for each child in your household, then you must complete an application listing all household members. Students eligible for free meals are entitled to one breakfast and one lunch meal each day. Ala-carte items, milk only, or additional meals are not included and are at an additional cost.

If your child was approved for free or reduced-price meals during the 07-08 school year, he/she will continue to receive those meal benefits until Oct. 15, 2008 or until a current application for the 08-09 school year is processed. Meal benefits for new applications cannot start until an application is approved. Please send a lunch or money for a paid lunch until you receive notice that the application is approved.

Student meals are processed on a computer in the cafeteria. Each student has an account whether they use it or not. To use the account, money needs to be deposited to the account prior to eating. When the student goes through the meal line the appropriate amount will be deducted from the account based on their status of Paid or Reduced-price. Students approved for Free do not need to deposit money unless a parent is going to be eating a meal.

Charging is discouraged and should only be used in an emergency. The District School Board policy is to allow up to 3 charges for K-5 grades and one charge for 6-8 grades. If you receive a notice of meal charges for your child, please include additional money for future meals. Parents should be contacted if their child exceeds the maximum charges. At this point you will need to send a lunch with your child until the account has sufficient funds for meals or if you have made specific arrangements with the kitchen manager. Please do not put the food service staff in the uncomfortable position of having to deny your child a meal or providing a limited alternative selection.

EMERGENCY NOTIFICATIONS

Telephone Calling System

Corvallis School District now uses an automated calling system for school closures and emergencies. The auto-dialer has the ability to call all families in the school district or just those at a selected school or building. This new method is in addition to our other means of communication (e.g., web site, radio stations, Flash Alert), and should not be relied upon as a sole source of information.

Home numbers are used for school closures due to weather or other emergency conditions, with calls beginning at 5:30 a.m. starting with the high school families followed by elementary and then middle school. If a school is closed during the day the daytime numbers listed on student registration cards will be used.

If you wish to opt out of this calling system, please notify our district office by calling Bernie Feyerherm at 757-5811.

Media Communications

When the decision has been made to cancel school, close the district, or delay the start, we also rely on the district web site, emergency phone trees, local radio, television stations, and the web Flash Alert for notification to staff and parents. District emergency numbers are 757-5811 and 757-4555.

Another new e-mail feature this year for each of our schools is the LISTSERV. One of the ways the school LISTSERVs will be used to is to distribute individual school emergency information. For inclusion on this list, please follow the directions below.

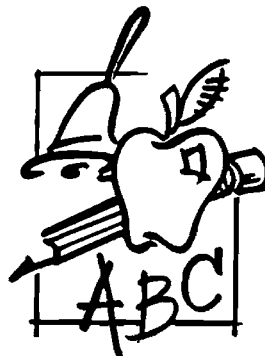

Student Visitor Guidelines

- Visitation is not allowed if the guest student lives within 60 miles of Corvallis (Valley League principal's agreement).
- The guest must be of high school age and a "student in good standing" at their school.
- A "Visitor's Request Form" must be completed by the host student at least 24 hours prior to the visit (available in the main office).
- Any violation of school guidelines during the visit may result in both students being sent home.



Attendance

CHS needs your help in reporting absences. If your child has been or will be absent, please call the CHS Attendance Office at 757-5888 as soon as possible. If you do not call, the computer will record your child's absence as unexcused. After 48 hours, absences cannot be excused. Notes are not accepted in place of a phone call.

Absences may be excused at the request of a student's parent/guardian because of illness, disability, illness in the immediate family requiring the student's presence, a family emergency, religious reasons or anything the school deems appropriate (up to 5 pre-arranged absences per semester). Students who are eighteen years old may request their own absences be excused.

Encourage your child to attend all classes; but if a class is missed, clear excused absences in a timely fashion by calling to give the exact date of absence, clock or period of absence and please spell the student's last name clearly.

Do you still get a phone call from the "Automated" call system? - even AFTER you have called the Attendance line to excuse your student? Please be aware that when you have called to excuse your student from being absent for a certain period class, your student still may have missed another class the same day, in which the Automated phone system will dial out for the class that is left unexcused.

Please make arrangements with your student(s) prior to school hours about doctor and orthodontic appointments, as well as any other medical or non-medical appointments. Unless there is an emergency - all notes will be posted on student lockers as we try to avoid "reminder" notes to students. It disrupts class time.

An "Attendance Record" is posted outside of the Attendance Office. This record shows the student's attendance for the previous day and current day. If you receive an "Automated" telephone call stating that your student has missed one or more classes, please have your student check the attendance record to see which teacher marked them absent. If this was an error the student and teacher can resolve it. I look forward to another great year! Thank you for your cooperation.
