SENIORS: REMINDER!! Four school weeks are required for processing college applications which require teacher or counselor recommendations. If you have an application due on or before January 11 which requires recommendations, and you have not seen your counselor yet, you will need to make an appointment by November 13. Application deadlines of January 14-18 require a counselor appointment by December 1; and a deadline of February 1 requires a counselor appointment by December 9. (When you make an appointment, please be certain of your college deadlines!)
