## Message from Cherie Stroud, Principal

It is a very hopeful time in the Corvallis school district! With the passing of the local option levy, Crescent Valley will benefit in the following ways:

- Hiring four new teachers in core subject areas to reduce class size
- Hiring one professional technical education teacher
- Approximately \$150,000 for athletics/activities

We appreciate the community's support in passing this levy so that we can continue to provide an exceptional educational program for CV students. Thank you for your endorsement of this necessary funding!

The high schools are once again evaluating the daily schedule. Under the direction of Superintendent Tarzian, a committee comprised of parents and staff are evaluating how our current high school schedule meets both the instructional and developmental needs of our students. Parents have expressed their concerns about unassigned or open periods during the school day, and that the start of the school day is too early, which prevents students from getting the necessary sleep research tells us is needed by adolescents. Lately, I have heard concerns about semester-long, instead of yearlong classes, especially in math and world language. I would like to share some of the benefits achieved in semester-long block classes:

- The value of the semester-long class is that the teacher instructs the students every day. This daily instruction maximizes student learning by eliminating wasted time to review content because of a day in between class meetings. Teachers waste less time taking attendance and settling students into class, allowing more time for actual instruction.
- The block class allows teachers to spend more time with each individual student, getting to know them, working individually with them or grading and providing feedback on their work. If students met all year, teachers would double their student caseload, seeing approximately 225 students in a grading period. This would greatly reduce the amount of available time for any one student. The semester class reduces this caseload to approximately 110 students.
- Teachers report that students do not significantly lose knowledge acquired from a previous year, because they learned it well given the daily instruction.
- In my conversations with students, many report the same thing; they do better when the class meets daily, and retain much of what they learned.
- The semester-long classes allow students to double up in math or world language in their junior or senior years, if desired. Year-long classes would not allow this.

At the November parent coffee, I shared the results of the

Oregon Healthy Teens survey, a comprehensive system for collecting information on the health and well-being of youth. This report highlights key results from 11<sup>th</sup> grade students surveyed at CV during the 2005-2006 school year. This is a voluntary, research-based survey, and participants remain anonymous. According to the results, CV students who were surveyed use tobacco products, drugs and alcohol at a lower rate than the state averages. However, the use of alcohol, marijuana and methamphetamines is higher than last year's percentages. As an update to our comprehensive plan to address drug/alcohol use on school grounds, the following activities and timelines have been developed:

- Staff training by sheriff deputies Van Meter and Weikel was held on November 1.
  - Results of the school climate survey were shared with all students during advisor. Student feedback reflects a concern with the drug/alcohol use during school hours. Representatives from advisor groups will be meeting to discuss how to address this issue through advisor groups.
  - A support group for parents whose son/daughter has been cited for use during school hours or activities began in early November. The group will meet for three sessions throughout November with an opportunity to expand the meetings as needed.
  - On November 29, CVHS will host a parent information/awareness night, beginning at 7pm in the auditorium. The OSU School of Pharmacy will present information on drug/alcohol effects and use. Additionally, Judge Connell will speak personally and professionally about his experiences. The evening will conclude with a resource fair in the cafeteria, providing information regarding community resources for students and parents for prevention and intervention.
  - On December 11-22, OSU pharmacy students will present information to students during B block classes.
- Congratulations to all of our fall sports and activities participants! Our Crescent Valley students positively represent our school in the Mid-Willamette Conference, and we are very proud of them!

## Administrative News

### Attendance and Tardy Policies

Oregon law requires students to attend school until they are 18 years old, until they graduate from high school, or until they complete an approved alternative education program. When students are absent from school, state

guidelines determine if the absence is excused, unexcused or unresolved.

**EXCUSED ABSENCE:** An absence for personal or family illness; family emergency; school activity; religious holiday; medical, dental or court appointment; college visitation; or pre-arranged family commitment (up to 5 pre-arranged absences per semester).

**UNEXCUSED ABSENCE:** ANY reason other than those listed above (alarm did not go off, missed ride, etc.).

**UNRESOLVED ABSENCE:** An absence not cleared by the parent within 48 hours of the student's return to school. Absences CANNOT be excused after 48 hours without administrative approval.

**PRE-ARRANGED ABSENCE:** A form to be signed by parent and teachers, available in the attendance office, main office, or CV website, that must be turned in to the attendance office prior to the absence.

### Getting Messages to Students

Please arrange with your student prior to school hours regarding medical appointments, after-school transportation, lunches, etc. It is very disruptive to the learning environment to enter the room once class has begun. Therefore, we will not interrupt class unless there is an emergency. Students can check for messages posted on the kiosks in the main hallway or on the student's locker.

Customer service is important to us, and we try to accommodate family needs the best way possible. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

### School Attendance Areas/Transfers

Student transfer requests for the 2007-08 school year may now be submitted for all schools for grades 1-12. Requests must be received by 5pm on Friday, January 19.

Transfer requests should be made through the new online application process at the Corvallis School District website at <http://www.csd509j.net>. If you do not have internet access at home, free internet access is available at the district office, 1555 SW 35<sup>th</sup> Street, or at the Corvallis Public Library. For more information or assistance, please call Bernadette Feyerherm at 757-5811.

Transfer requests for the 2007-08 kindergarten program (also made online) may be submitted beginning the first day of school in February and must be received by the second Friday in March. Requests for kindergarten transfers will be approved unless the school's enrollment capacity has been met.

All applications will be assigned a random number for consideration rather than a "first-come first-served" basis. If transfer requests outnumber the space available in a school, a lottery will be held using the random number assigned to the request. Applications received after the deadline will be added to a waiting list in the order received.

### Absences for College Visits

Students who will be away from school two or more days for a college visit need to turn in a "pre-arranged absence" form to the attendance office before the absence occurs. These forms are available on CV's web page under the "Attendance" button or in the front office.

### Open Campus Guidelines at CV

Crescent Valley has a limited open campus policy. Freshmen are never allowed to leave campus during the school day without written parent permission. This means they may not leave with older classmates who drive. Many juniors and seniors have a drivers license and are therefore allowed to leave at lunch or during unassigned times. It is preferred that sophomores remain on campus, but it is not regulated at this time. Although resources for campus supervision are limited, we prefer that students stay on campus during the school day. They are never encouraged to leave campus. ### Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE)

WUE is the Western Undergraduate Exchange program through which students may enroll at many two-year and four-year public college programs at a reduced tuition level (150% of the institution's regular resident tuition). Many institutions require strong academic performance as evidenced by SAT/ACT scores and GPA. Colorado State University has reinstated its WUE scholarship, with \$5,925 renewable.
