## Message from Cherie Stroud, Principal

As I sit to write this article on this beautiful May morning, I am serenaded by a variety of beautiful birds as they feed. Their hectic pace is not unlike the frenzy we all experience this time of year— with the completion of one school year and preparation for the next. As a prelude to summer, the long and warm spring days are a reminder that a more restful time of year is just around the corner. Indeed, at Crescent Valley we are busy with creating next year's master schedule, hiring several new staff and fine-tuning the budget for next year.

With the passing of the Local Option Levy, next year's class sizes for the four core content areas have been decreased dramatically. Although the ninth and tenth grades were targeted for lower class sizes, averages across the grades are much lower than in previous years. Average class sizes for the 2007-08 school year are:

- English-27 students per class
- Math-27 students per class
- Science-26 students per class
- Social science-29 students per class

Although CV will not have any retirees this year, we are in the midst of hiring several new staff. This year's assistant principal, Jonathan Fost, has accepted a position with the Newberg School District. In July, he will take the helm as the English Language Learner (ELL) Director for that district. He is an expert in that field, and we wish him the best of luck as he forges into this new endeavor! Through a very comprehensive process, we hired Ayesha Freeman as the new assistant principal at CV.

Ayesha is currently serving as assistant principal at Mt. View High School in Vancouver, Washington. I completed a site visit to her school as part of the hiring process. Her staff and fellow administrators spoke highly of her leadership abilities, describing her with phrases such as "top-notch, has a real heart for kids, very thoughtful, great team player, excellent communicator, and very organized." They also spoke to her strong background in the areas of curriculum and instruction, and diversity.

Ayesha graduated from Vassar College in 1993. She taught high school social studies for nine years in Colorado and Beaverton before taking on her assistant principal assignment at Mt. View High School in fall 2006. Ayesha, her husband, and two children will move to Corvallis sometime this summer.

Several temporary teachers have been re-hired as permanent staff. They are: Ted Calcaterra in German and ELL, Michael Helle in art, Annika Mauelshagen in counseling, and Mary Johnson as a special education teacher. At this time, we have also hired Denny Bain as a new social studies teacher. Denny currently coaches track at CV and has been teaching social studies at Lebanon High School.

CV experienced great success in spring competitions this year, which are outlined in the Student Standouts section of this newsletter. Congratulations to the many fine athletes who competed well in spring sports!

Finally, I would like to express my sincere appreciation and gratitude to our parents. You have spent countless hours volunteering, preparing wonderful meals for our staff, purchasing classroom supplies and school equipment, sitting on school committees and supporting our students to achieve their potential in and out of the classroom. You make a difference in the lives of our students and in the essential operations of our school. Many of you voted for the Local Option Levy, which will make a difference in the quality of education afforded to all students through lower class sizes. We could never thank you enough for all you do; but, one last time for this year, THANK YOU!

### WHAT'S NEEDED

All freshmen, juniors or students new to CVHS athletic programs need **a physical exam before beginning practice**. Athletic fees (first sport-\$125, second sport-\$100, third sport-\$75, with a family limit of \$500 per year) for fall season sports can be paid during school registration (with a separate check for athletic fees). A clearance card showing all forms and fees have been processed is required prior to practicing.

### Athletic Eligibility

Oregon School Activities Association (OSAA) regulations affect any student planning to participate in next year's fall or winter athletic programs. Students who have failed to meet the OSAA requirement of successfully passing five credit classes during the spring semester must make up the deficiency over the summer through correspondence courses, online courses, 509J Summer Credit Clinic, LBCC, or OSU. ### Opening Windows to the World: The Crescent Valley Library Media Center

The end of the school year is near. Students should return all overdue library and textbooks now!

We also strongly encourage students to return any books that are no longer being used (dropped classes, finished assignments, etc.).

Students may check book status at school by going to the online library catalog, selecting the last tab labeled "Stuff," and entering their seven-digit ID number.

If students know they have lost or damaged books, they should contact library staff immediately. Damage includes writing, bent corners, broken spines, torn pages, moisture damage, etc. that was not previously noted adjacent to the barcode. Attention to this now will save money, time, and effort later.

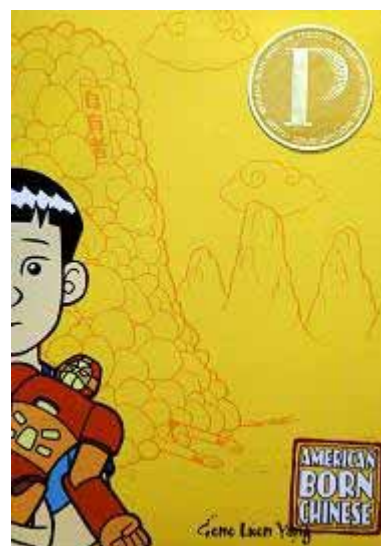
Students with overdue library and/or bookroom books or fines must return materials and pay bills before checking out additional items. Seniors will be denied graduation if materials are not returned to the library and fines paid by June 7. Returning students should bring back books and pay fines by June 14. A \$10 late fee will be assessed if books are not returned.

Any remaining late fees and fines must be paid at the time of registration next fall. Lines will be long, and it is easier to clear accounts now and avoid the late fee. Students are encouraged to see library staff with questions.

### New book: *American Born Chinese* by Gene Luen Yang (741.5 Y in the Graphic Novels section)



Gene Luen Yang has just won the 2007 Michael L. Printz Award for his masterful graphic novel *American Born Chinese*.

Yang draws from American pop culture and ancient Chinese mythology in his groundbreaking work. Expertly told in words and pictures, Yang's three-part story follows a Chinese American teenager's struggle to define himself. This is the first graphic novel to be recognized by the Michael L. Printz award, sponsored by Booklist magazine and a division of the American Library Association. It is named for the late Michael L. Printz, a school librarian known for discovering and promoting quality books for young adults.

We do not have enough money in our budget to pay for these items. We will be glad to give you a receipt that you can use for your taxes. Thank you!

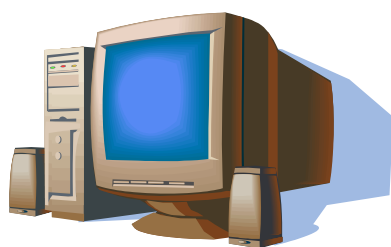
### Technology News
