Message from Cherie Stroud, Principal

"Life is a grindstone, and whether it grinds you down or polishes you up is for you alone to decide."

As we enter the final stretch of this school year, this quote, by Cavett Robert, rings especially true for me. The grind of our fast-paced lives often leaves us worn out. For me, no matter how physically tired I may get, my soul is always renewed by the work I "get" to do each day. Working with CV students, staff, and parents invigorates my spirit, providing new energy each day. Crescent Valley is an amazing place to work and play!

At this time, our projected enrollment for next year stands at 1,024 students. Based on this total, and weighted funding for special students categories, the funds allocated to our building have been established. The local option levy provides an additional \$472,272 in the budget for next year. According to the levy, these funds are targeted for specific areas, which include the following:

- four .83 FTE teachers, one each in math, science, social studies and English- \$247,672
- one 1.0 FTE Extended Learning Coordinator- \$74,600
- addition to activities/ athletics budget- \$150,000

The additional teachers will allow us to reduce class sizes, with ninth and tenth grade classes as a priority. The Extended Learning Coordinator will facilitate off-campus learning opportunities, such as internships and job shadows, for our students. In addition, the person in this position will take a lead role in providing support for students in accomplishing and documenting two new graduation requirements — Career Related Learning Experiences (CRLE) and an Extended Application, in which students apply and extend their knowledge in new and complex situations related to personal and career interests and post high school goals.

In addition to hiring new teachers, there are other changes in staff for next year. Andrea Hopkins and Julie Halsey have been granted a leave of absence. During the district staffing process, Dana Loso transferred to CV from Cheldelin to teach Spanish. Penny Bazanele will be heading to CHS in order to maintain her full-time teaching status in French. Judy Westlake will be splitting her librarian duties equally between CV and CHS. Amber Boedigheimer will come to CV as a Library Media Specialist to assist with library duties. The hiring process will keep us busy for the next few weeks, as we hope to hire for all openings before the end of the school year.

I had the wonderful opportunity to join the CV Robotics team at the Sacramento Regional Robotics competition on March 30 and 31. I very much enjoyed learning the ins and outs of a Robotics match, but was most impressed by the school spirit exhibited by our school. Although our robot did

not always cooperate, our enthusiasm never waned. What a great group of students and parents! Crescent Valley was by far the most spirited group of fans in the stadium. I would encourage everyone to attend a Robotics competition; you will be amazed at what our students accomplish!

Congratulations to our band and choir; both took first place in the Mid-Willamette Conference district competitions in April! We are very proud of their success and wish them well in the state finals in May!

Oregon Healthy Teens Survey

On May 23, 11th grade CV students will be participating in the Oregon Healthy Teens Survey (OHT). The OHT is a paper and pencil survey sponsored by the Oregon Department of Education, Commission on Children and Families, and the Department of Human Services. The survey will gather information about health risk behaviors of high school students in grades 8 through 12 (based on the 11th grade sample of students). The survey includes questions about nutrition, physical activity, tobacco, alcohol, and drug use, personal safety and violence-related behavior, HIV knowledge, mental health, suicide, harassment, sexual risk behavior/attitudes, and interactions — with peers, adults, school staff, and community members — that influence youth well-being.

Completing the Oregon Healthy Teens Survey poses minimal risk to your child, who may feel embarrassed or uncomfortable answering the questions. Survey procedures have been designed to protect your child's privacy and allow for anonymous participation. While we encourage all selected students to participate, the decision to participate is voluntary. You may opt to send a refusal for your child's participation. Alternatively, your child will have the opportunity to refuse at the time of the survey. There will be no action against you or your child if your child does not participate.

Permission forms were mailed to all 11th grade parents with the report cards the week of April 18. If you do **not** wish your child to take this survey, return this form to the principal's office before the survey date of May 23. You only need to return this form if you **do not** wish your child to participate.

Athletic Eligibility

Oregon School Activities Association (OSAA) regulations affect any student planning to participate in next year's fall or winter athletic programs. Students who have failed to meet the OSAA requirement of successfully passing five credit classes during the spring semester must make up the deficiency over the summer through correspondence courses, online courses, 509J Summer Credit Clinic, LBCC, or OSU. The OSAA will not accept hardship referrals for credit deficiencies. Overdue Books

The end of the school year is near. Students should return all overdue library and textbooks now. We also strongly encourage students to return any books that are no longer used (dropped classes, finished assignments, etc.). Students may check book status at school by going to the online library catalog, selecting the last tab labeled "Stuff," and entering their 7-digit ID number. If students know they have lost or damaged books, they should contact library staff immediately. Damage includes writing, bent corners, broken spines, torn pages, moisture damage, etc. that is not previously noted adjacent to the barcode. Attention to this now will save money, time, and effort later. We will begin compiling our list of charges soon, based on overdue books and outstanding fines.

Beginning May 1, students with overdue library/bookroom books and fines must return materials and pay bills before checking out additional items. Seniors will be denied graduation if materials are not returned to the library and fines paid by June 7. Returning students should return books and pay fines by June 14. A \$10 late fee will be also assessed.

All late fees and fines must be paid at the time of registration next fall. Lines are long, and it is easier to clear accounts now. Students are encouraged to see library staff with questions.

Bookroom Volunteers

Help would also be welcome on June 15 and 18 if any ambitious folks are willing to stay around to help us with "clean-up" (repairs, shelving, etc.). New book: *A Long Way Gone: Memoirs of a Boy Soldier* by Ishmael Beah

(921 BEA in the CV Library)

This heartbreaking autobiography tells the true story of a 12-year-old boy swept up in Sierra Leone's civil war. This war led to homelessness and starvation for Ishmael Beah. He was finally forced into the army, where for 5 years he was lost in drugs, torture, and killing. The casual slaughter in which he participated only ended for Beah when he was 15 and rescued and "rehabilitated" by UNICEF. At 17, he was brought to the United States and graduated in 2004 from Oberlin College and is now living in New York City. In this highly recommended book, he shares with us his own

experience with the horror of war, and forces us to understand the ongoing misery of child soldiers throughout the world. *For young adults and adults.*
