For this activity, you will use the **Work Importance Locator**, a self-assessment tool that helps you clarify what is most important to you in a job.

1. **Go** to Internet Explorer.
 2. **Type** in Web address for Career Information System: **oregoncis.uoregon.edu/cisonline**
 3. **Click** on the **yellow triangle** to login.
 - a. **Username:** firstnamelastname
 - b. **Password:** initialsstudentID#

4. On the left hand side, look for **Exploration tools**.
 5. Click on **Work Importance Locator**.
 6. **Read** over the page. At the bottom **Click** on **Explore your Work Values**.
 7. **Read** over the page. At the bottom **Click** on **Place the Cards**.
 8. **Follow** the directions to complete the activity.
 9. At the bottom **Click** on **Get my Results**.
 10. **Click** on **My Scores**.

 - b. **Click** on two of the occupations in the list.
