








CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS


Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE


Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.


ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2019-20 graduating in 2022-23.




FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

School Goals

CVHS aims to improve the percentage of 9th graders finishing the year on-track to graduate.

CVHS will continue to focus on our on-time graduation rate with particular emphasis on students with disabilities and students navigating poverty.

The activities to support these goals include: targeted intervention classes, Paths to the Future classes, writing and math support classes, team taught Biology course, weekly advisor classes, Summer School, after school tutoring and a dedicated Student Success Coach

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is collaborating with school districts and communities across the state to achieve a 90% on-time graduation rate by 2027. Grounded in the pillars of Academic Excellence, Belonging and Wellness, and Reimagined Accountability, ODE prioritizes evidence-based practices to boost early literacy, attendance, and student engagement. We are committed to closing opportunity and achievement gaps for marginalized students and securing long-term success for all of Oregon's learners by investing in culturally responsive practices, fostering inclusive environments and always driving for continuous improvement.



ADVANCED COURSEWORK

CVHS has Advanced Placement Courses in Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science, Art and World Languages and Career and Technical Education Programs.

Dual credit is offered in partnership with Linn Benton Community College.

- 8 Honors courses: 3 English, 1 Social Studies, 3 Math, 1 Science
- 11 Advanced Placement courses: 2 English, 2 Social Studies, 3 Science, 2 Math, 2 World Language
- College Now coursework, dual enrollment opportunities, Running Start Advance Diploma Program
