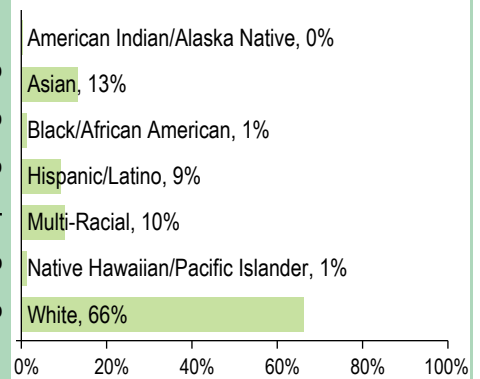

**ACADEMIC SUPPORT**

Franklin provides a strong and responsive RTI program in math and literacy to identify and support students needing intervention support. Our special education team works effectively with staff and parents to design and implement instructional programs and curriculum to meet the diverse needs of students with disabilities. Educational Assistants are utilized via RTI and special education to provide academic support for targeted students.

The English Language Development program supports students whose first language is not English, in order to help them be successful in their language development and in the core curriculum.

Mentoring and Peer Tutoring are utilized to support students.

**ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT**

- The Core Knowledge Curriculum provides a comprehensive academic content and skills based program on which students are able to build on their learning each year.
- Fine Arts instruction correlates with classroom learning.
- All classrooms provide embedded enrichment opportunities for students during the year.
- After school world language enrichment classes offered in Spanish, French and Chinese.
- Buddy Classes utilized to intentionally take advantage of spiraled curriculum.
- Our students participate in Oregon Battle of the Books and Science Olympiad.
- The staff provides differentiated instruction in Literacy and Math.
- 7th graders travel to Washington DC annually on an educational field trip.
