



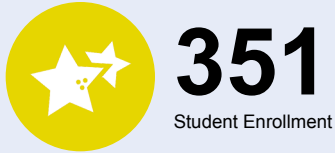

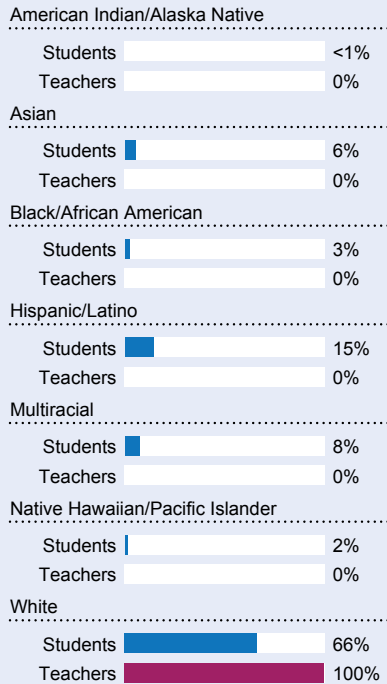

We believe all students can learn and succeed, and we base our instruction on a balanced and comprehensive curriculum. We recognize the importance of foundational skills in reading, writing and math instruction, and we work hard to provide meaningful and integrated learning experiences in all content areas.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

We continuously encourage students to make positive behavior choices by implementing Positive Behavior Intervention and Support (PBIS).

PBIS is a program designed to teach safety, respect, and responsibility at our school. Through instruction, comprehension and regular practice, all staff members implement a consistent set of behavior expectations. When some students respond in unexpected ways, we view it as an opportunity for re-teaching and learning.
