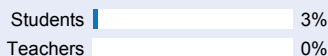

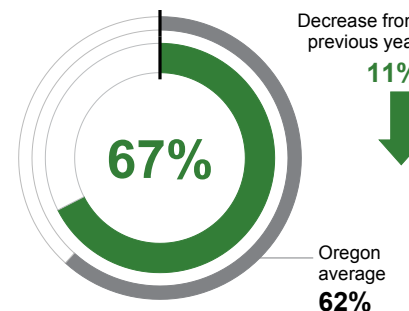

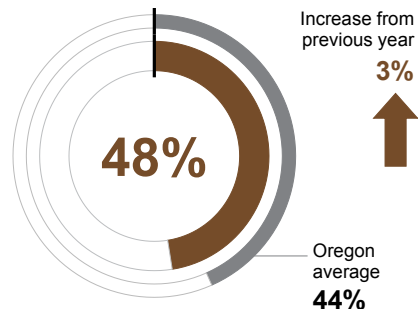

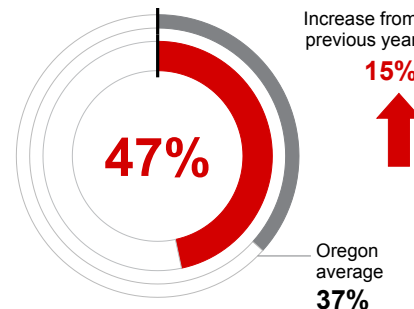
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



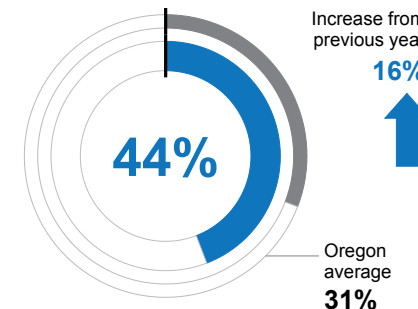
MATHEMATICS

School Goals

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2027. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

PBIS is a program designed to teach respect, responsibility, and safety at our school. We encourage students to make positive behavior choices by implementing this program.

Through instruction, comprehension and regular practice, all staff members implement a consistent set of behavior expectations and rules. When some students respond in unexpected ways, we view it as an opportunity for re-teaching, not punishment.
