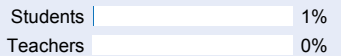

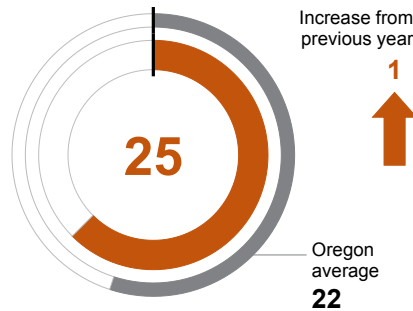

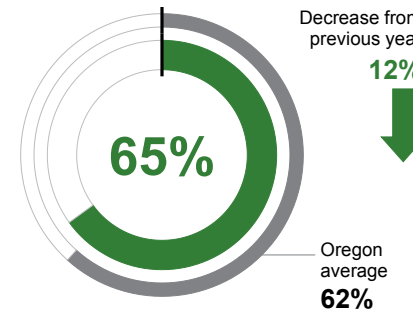
CLASS SIZE

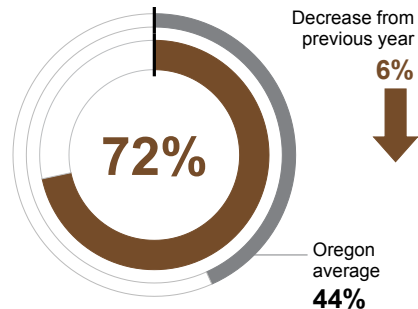

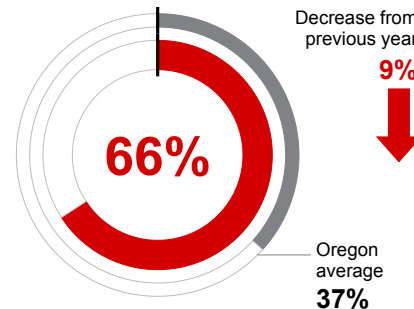

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



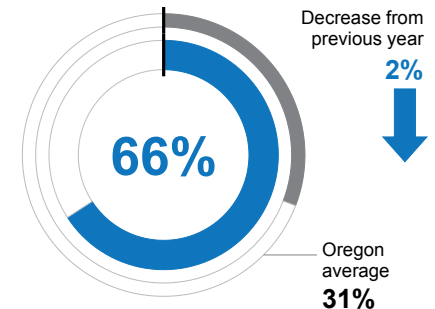
MATHEMATICS

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2027. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

Building relationships and skills is our goal. Bessie Coleman staff support each student by addressing needs and building skills. We build skills with a focus on Collaborative Problem Solving and fostering a Caring School Community. We continuously support students by implementing Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) schoolwide, with a focus on safety, respect, and responsibility. Our school staff includes a mental health and wellness team composed of a counselor, mental health therapist, mental health skills trainer, and family advocate.

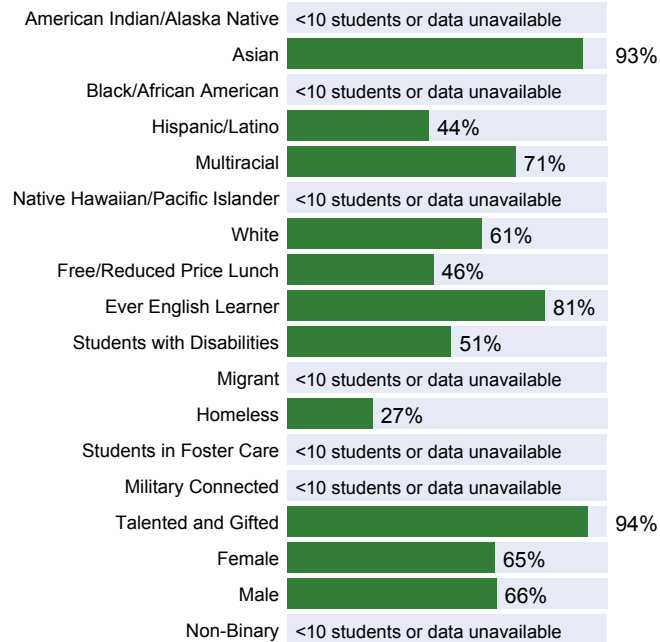

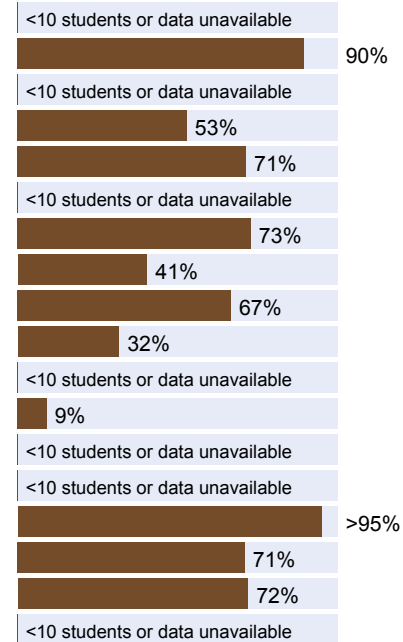

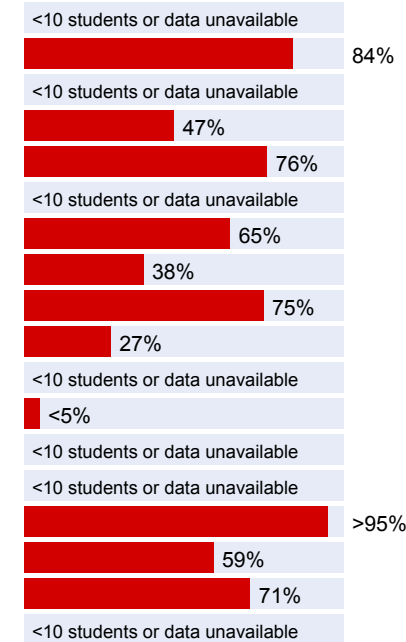

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

Corvallis schools are committed to providing a safe and positive learning environment for all students. All students are taught how to recognize, refuse, and report bullying so that we are able to respond to safety concerns appropriately.
