3. Radon

4. Lead in Drinking Water

Upon recommendation by the Oregon Department of Education and Oregon Health Authority, and in compliance with EPA 3 Ts for Reducing Lead in Drinking Water in Schools, the district will:

1. **Identify sources of lead:** Schools and childcare facilities should test all taps used for drinking or food preparation in the building to identify any lead problems. Follow the Environmental Protection Agency's 3 T's Revised Technical Guidance to ensure that samples for lead are collected properly and from the right places. Use an OHA-accredited drinking water laboratory to analyze samples for lead.
2. **Stop access:** Prevent access to water taps that have more than 20 parts per billion (ppb) of lead. This should include shutting off taps, covering water fountains, and providing bottled water to students and staff members.
3. **Communicate:** Make results from tests for lead in water available to students, families, and the community as quickly as possible. Lead results will be posted on the district's website at: <http://www.csd509j.net/en-us/districtinformation/departmentservices/facilitiesmaintenance.aspx>
4. **Mitigate and correct:** Replace the sources of lead in building plumbing. Again, EPA 3T's Guidance should be followed.

The district will test 20% of all fixtures district-wide every year to ensure that every drinking water distribution point is tested every five years.

5. Lead Paint

In order to comply with the United States Environmental Protection Agency's Renovation, Repair and Painting Program Rule, the district will only contract with certified lead based paint renovation contractors licensed by the Oregon Construction Contractors Board and district staff are certified by the Oregon Health Authority to perform the work.

6. Integrated Pest Management

7. Communication

The district will make all test results and detailed information explaining the test results available to the public within five business days of receiving the results. Results will be made available by posting the results on the district website, sending notice of the results over the email system, and making the results available in hardcopy at the main administration office.
