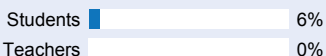

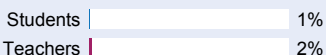

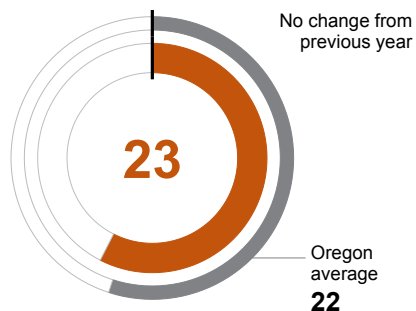

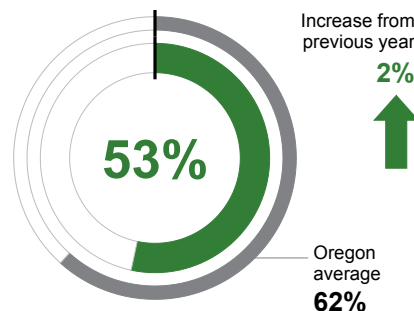
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

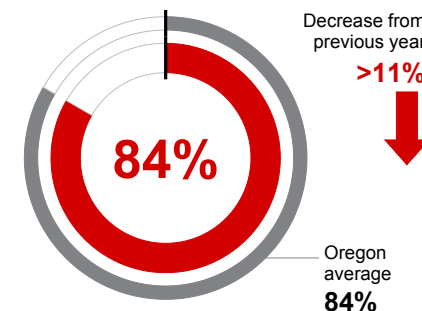
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

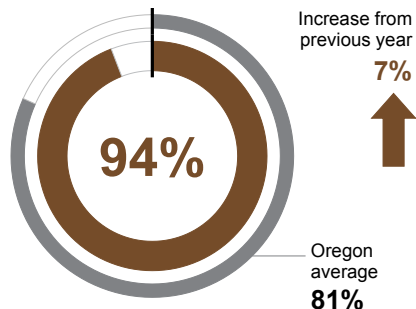
Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.

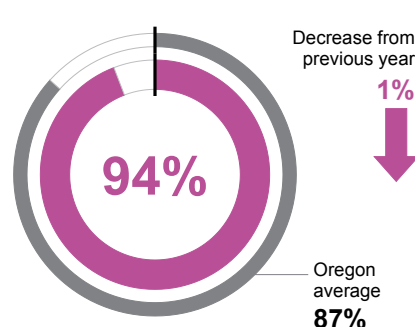
ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2018-19 graduating in 2021-22.



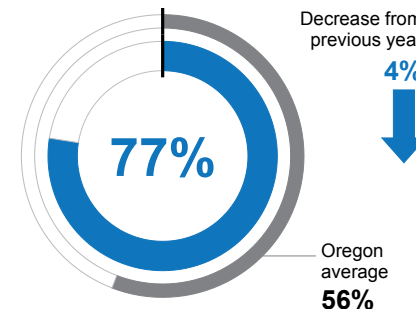
FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

School Goals

We are continuing our "Freshman Success" class to help our ninth graders stay on track. We will continue to support the individual needs of our students working to recover core credit in Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Studies, and Science in a self-paced environment. Our seniors will all have a "Senior Seminar" class to help complete career education requirements and preparation for life after graduation.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2027. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

CVHS is focused on building a positive school culture where every student, staff member, and parent feels included and valued. We will continue our "Paths 2 the Future" class that includes and supports students with disabilities in school and opportunities beyond school. For incoming ninth graders, we have our "Link Crew" program comprised of upperclassmen and staff to support our new students as they transition into our school community.

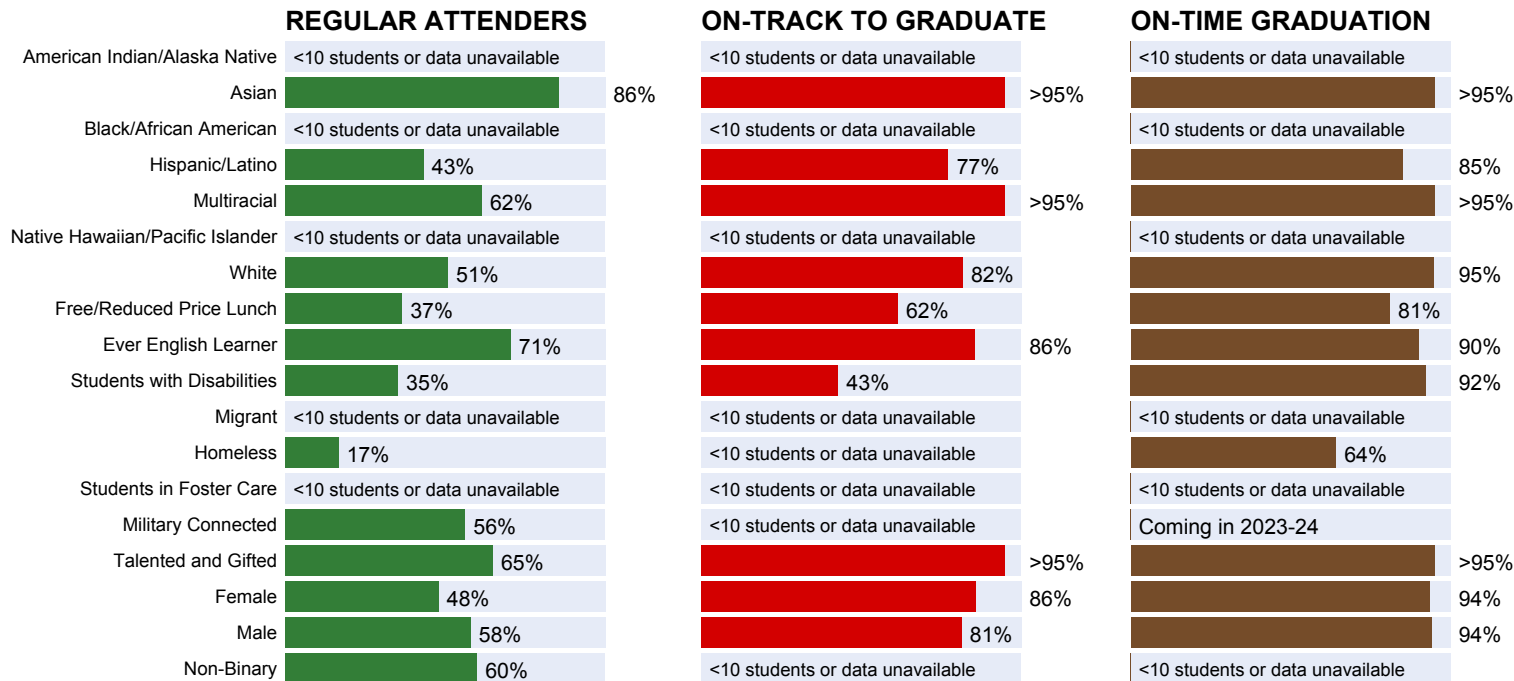
