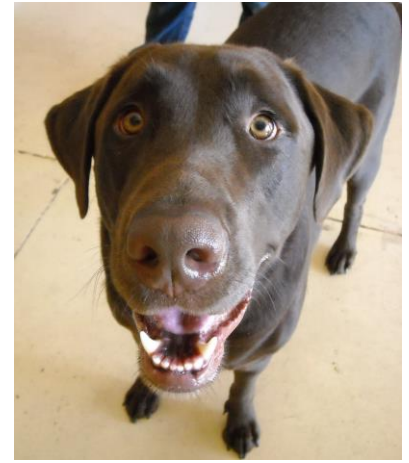


# Dog-training Research Program for Children with Developmental Differences



**Currently enrolling for SUMMER 2024!**

Oregon State University is looking for families with a **child ages 10-17 years** who has a **developmental difference** (such as anxiety/depression, ADHD, ASD, dyslexia, etc.) **and a pet dog**.

- Each child and dog pair participates in 10 training sessions, each lasting approximately 55 minutes
- Each family participates in three assessments - one before training, one after training, and one 1 year later. Assessments include answering survey questions and dog behavior activities.
- \$25 gift card at each assessment

- To explore the potential benefits of a dog-assisted intervention on your child's social well-being and physical activity levels
- To provide an engaging experience for your family dog, potentially fostering a deeper bond between your child and their dog
