


Home Guide for the iPad

Part 1: SETUP Wi-Fi

1. On the iPad, tap Settings 
2. In the left pane, tap Wi-Fi
3. In the right pane, under Choose a Network, tap the name of your home WiFi network.
4. In the pop-up window, type the password to your home WiFi, then tap Join


Part 2: CONNECT THROUGH THE FILTER TO THE INTERNET

Student devices are required to go through the district's Internet filter even when they connect through an outside Wi-Fi network, such as at home. In this situation, students must manually authenticate to the filter prior to using an app or navigating to a website. In order to do so they will need to set their ipad to filter through the proxy manually. Below are the instructions.

1. Tap the overlapping pages icon in the upper right. 
2. Tap the X in the upper left of each open webpage to close out all the open websites
3. Tap the Home button once to return to the main screen.

4. Open the Safari browser  and type in the web address of any appropriate website.
5. In the iBoss filter login screen, type john for the username and john for the password. Click Submit.
6. Proceed to navigate in the web browser and use the apps needed for the assignment.

Part 3: DOWNLOAD APPS FROM SELF SERVICE

1. If you haven't done so, complete Part 2 of this document first.
2. Tap on the Self Service app  (you may need to swipe to the left to get to another screen).
3. Tap Install next to each app needing to be installed. If prompted, type in your Student Account password ([Upper case first initial][Lower case last initial].[8-digit Student ID]) Notice the period!

DEVICE PREPAREDNESS

We expect students to be prepared with their iPads every day by:

1. Coming to school with their iPad.
2. Their iPad is at least at 50% when they come to school.

The iPad needs roughly 5 hours to get from 0% to 100%. Returning 7th and 8th grade students have their lightning cables and power bricks from last year. New 6th graders and new students were given their own set, which is expected to last them throughout their time at middle school.
