



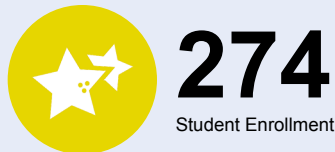

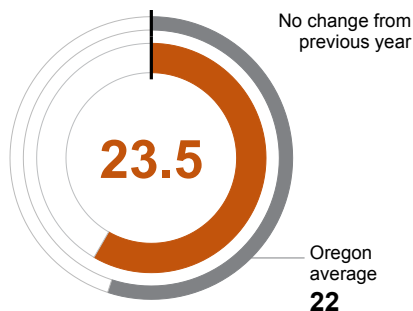

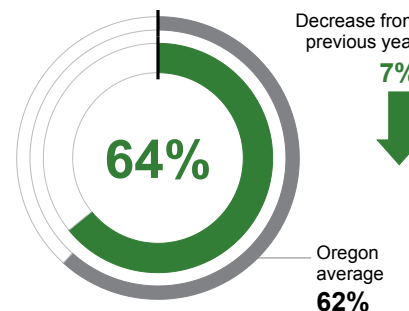
CLASS SIZE

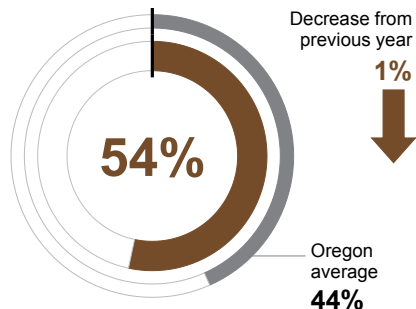

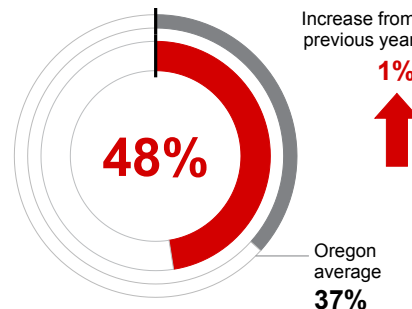
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



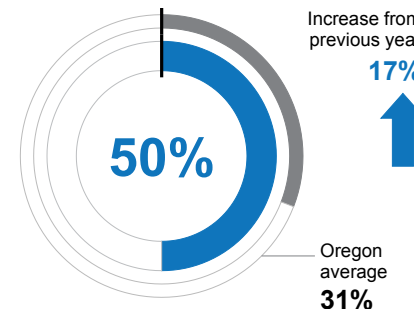
MATHEMATICS

School Goals

Our focus on Multi-tiered Systems of Support ensures students who are in need of reading, math, or behavior intervention receive the help that they need.

All staff are dedicated to equity based intervention services in order to achieve the district goals of Closing the Opportunity Gap, Growth for All, and Every Child a Graduate.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2027. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

We continuously encourage students to make positive behavior choices by implementing PBIS, a program designed to teach respect, responsibility, and safety at our school.

Through instruction, comprehension and regular practice, all staff members implement a consistent set of behavior expectations and rules. When students respond in unexpected ways, we view it as an opportunity for re-teaching, not punishment.
